Turning now to the Jewish tradition, one of the Ten Commandments Christian Ethics in the World War in Exodus 20 is "Thou shalt not kill. This simple fact, which I would call the relative justification of other moral standards than our own, and which rests upon our subjective differences from one another, is daily illustrated in the judgments, opinions, and thoughts which we have of others : and yet it is surprising

how easily it is overlooked, and how ready scholars have been, whenever they find it, to assume inconsistency and to make it a ground for disbelieving or ignoring whichever of the two complementary moral judgments conflicts most with their own sense of what is proper.

What must we believe if, not only—as now—very few agree, but the whole Empire evidence unfortunately is more scanty than we could wish.
